



UN Migration Agency supports Government in identifying ways to raise awareness of trafficking in persons (TiP)

October, Windhoek: As part of the Counter-Trafficking Project on Strengthening coordination to respond to trafficking in persons (TIP) and ensure justice and protection for all victims of trafficking (VoT) in Namibia, the UN Migration Agency (IOM) is supporting the Namibian Government in raising awareness of TiP to increase the reporting of potential TIP cases.

The purpose is to ensure the public is well informed about the phenomenon to decrease their chances of falling victim to trafficking.

IOM organised a Pre-Testing, at the Namibia University of Science and Technology (NUST) and the Katutura Youth Centre (KYC), of two concepts for the Awareness Raising Campaign set to be launched by the end of this year, to gauge whether the campaign will be instrumental in the identification, prevention and protection of VoT.
